




Race Percentage in Population Shiloh Hills Demographics

Washington Environmental Health Disparities Map (3 Census tracks) Our median annual income is \$34,401 \$10,000 less than the median income for the City of Spokane.




- Our 650 business produce the most City Revenue of all neighborhoods outside of Downtown
